

RAIL WORKERS Hazardous Materials Training Program



COURSE ANNOUNCEMENT

The Rail Workers Hazardous Materials Training Program is funded by a federal grant from the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences (NIEHS) to provide hazmat training to rail workers. The hazmat training courses will provide rail workers the essential knowledge, skills, and response actions in the case of an unintentional release. These tools will allow rail workers to protect themselves, their co-workers, and their communities.

2-Hr Hazard Recognition Course

Saturday, 02/17/2024 11AM EST (Virtual Classroom Training)

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed to increase workers' knowledge of the process of identifying potential hazards in the workplace. The goal of hazard recognition is to prevent accidents, illnesses, and injuries by identifying hazards before they can cause harm to employees or others, as well as property damage. It is an ongoing process that involves regular inspections, audits, and employee training to ensure that hazards are identified and controlled promptly.

2-Hr Disaster Response/Recovery Awareness Course TBD (Virtual Classroom Training)

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course satisfies the requirements to assist workers and communities in recovery from natural and man-made disasters. This training is specifically targeted at developing disaster response and recovery in areas likely to experience hurricanes, floods, earthquakes, wildfires and tornados.

2-Hr Heat Injury and Illness Prevention Awareness Training TBD (Virtual Classroom Training)

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed to increase workers' knowledge of heat injury and illness prevention. This course will cover topics on heat stress and how it can impact your health and safety at work, how heat stress and illness can be prevented, and strategies your employer can use to minimize your risk of exposure.

COURSE FORMAT

This is a virtual course which will be conducted via Zoom. This course will maximize online interactions between instructors and facilitators with student-workers. All students will be able to engage with course material as well as work in groups collectively.
